### Martin's General Store Museum

Since 1985, the HMCA has maintained the old Martin's General Store, in the heart of the Millburn Historic District, as a museum preserving the history of our unique area. The store was generously left to the HMCA, along with an endowment for its preservation, by Mr. Richard Martin, whose family had owned and operated the store since 1910. Built in 1862, the building contains a collection of historic artifacts related to the history of our area since its settlement in the mid 19th century.

### **MUSEUM HOURS**

Martin's General Store Museum will be open by appointment again this year. We are working on new signage with contact information so that interested visitors can make an appointment to visit us.

### Millburn Church Celebrates 175 Years

Beginning as a small meeting house serving a new settlement in 1840, Millburn Congregational United Church of Christ is proud to celebrate its 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Originally established as a church for all people, the First Religious Society and Congregational Church of Millburn, Illinois represented a religious home for the Protestant denominations of the village that would come to be known as Millburn. Soon, Father William Bradford Dodge came to Millburn and served as minister for the church from 1844-1862. It was under his leadership that the church passed a resolution to support the Underground Railroad and its mission of "letting the oppressed go free." Reverend Dodge was also instrumental in establishing the Millburn Mutual Fire Insurance Company to help protect the local farmsteads and businesses from devastating loss.

The church grew with the community. A succession of ministers served with dedication while the church continued to inspire community events and religious focus. The building changed throughout the decades, with extensive renovation in 1887 and the addition of the first church piano, a Steinway, in 1888. Groups such as the Millburn Ladies' Aid Society (formerly The Sewing Circle), guest lecturers and entertainers helped establish the church as a cornerstone of the Millburn community.

Despite the frantic efforts of men, women and firefighters from Antioch, Lake Villa and Gurnee, the historic structure reared in 1867 was lost to fire on January 12, 1935. Worship and Sunday school were held in Millburn school. Then, the church received a gift from the Chicago Congregational Union — the church building of the Third Congregational Church of Oak Park. Building materials and components were painstakingly dismantled and brought to Millburn — the windows, pews, pianos, and materials were all loaded with care into trucks, while pots and pans, hymnals, carpets and pictures came by automobile. The Millburn congregation held its first worship service in the new building on June 6, 1937.

### Millburn Church (cont.)

Responding to growth in its activities and membership, the church added an educational wing with a new kitchen space and large meeting hall in 1968. More recently, in 2005, the church again expanded with a building addition further to the west, with new offices, new preschool space, and a large meeting room.

To celebrate the rich history of Millburn Congregational United Church of Christ, the church will be hosting a variety of events throughout 2015. Historic displays are being created to be shared with the community. Events include a Pulled Pork Dinner to be held on Saturday, June 6, and a Historic Ice Cream Social on Sunday, June 28. Then, Millburn Church will welcome current, past, and interested parishioners during Rally Home Sunday weekend events on September 11-13.
