Susannah Smith and the Civil War By Diana Dretske, Curator and Historian

During the American Civil War, Susannah "Susie" Smith (1839-1914) rallied behind the Millburn boys, who enlisted to preserve the Union. Her letters to the soldiers and support of aid societies buoyed the spirits of the fighting men.


Susie was the daughter of George E. Smith and Mercy Gwinn Loring of Salem, Massachusetts. The Smiths came to Millburn in 1839 and purchased land north of town on W. Miller Road where they farmed and raised sheep.

In the second summer of the Civil War, Susie's brother, George E. Smith Jr. (1842-1915), enlisted in Company D with the 96th Illinois. Dozens of men from the area enlisted, including John. K. Pollock, Richard and Alexander Thain, William Bonner Jr., David J. Minto, and George C. Dodge, the grandson of Rev. Wm. B. Dodge of the Millburn Congregational Church.

As the men marched off to the war's Western Theater, a key to their success was to retain a strong connection to home and to know that their families and neighbors supported them. Susie wrote frequently to her brother George and his tent mates in the 96th Illinois, which brought comfort and eased the hardships of the soldiers' lives. George wrote to her: "the boys in the tent all said that [your letter] beat all the letters they ever heard and that it ought to be printed."

After the Union's victorious Atlanta Campaign (May 7–September 2, 1864), Susie wrote: "Our Boys in Blue grow hopeful as they see



the bright glad sun of peace gleaming through the darkness of this terrible war." The triumph of the campaign renewed hope and lifted Abraham Lincoln to victory in the November election.

Susie bolstered support for the war on the home front as a contributor and "editress" of the pro-Union newsletter the *Millburn Union Casket*, named for the treasures it held inside its pages. This handwritten paper included original poetry and excerpts from soldiers' letters.

When George Smith returned home in 1865, Susie wrote in her diary: "I look across to where my brother sits, he who has fought amid the fiercest battles... [God] has brought him safe through all the trials and dangers." In 1864, George was selected for the newly created Ambulance Corps. According to the Regiment's history, he was known to "go anywhere for a wounded man, and very often at great [personal] risk."

After the war's end, Susie supported the North's hard-won victory by contributing to veterans' aid societies and making quilts for emancipated African Americans.

On May 20, 1869, Susie married David J. Minto, and they settled on the Minto Farm on Deep Lake Road near Loon Lake.


